The arrival of June'25 and a new school year started. For others, this is a much-awaited event replete with excitement and underpinned by confidence. For others, there is apprehension and even fear. Parents can ease their children's preparation for school in several ways—either by channelling their excitement or easing some fears.

First, parents can be of assistance by creating a realistic schedule of extracurricular activities that will allow sufficient time for homework and homework-studying. After-school sports leagues, dance lessons, and music lessons are all starting to take enrollments, and the urge to sign up for every activity that interests the child is strong—after all, wouldn't being busy and active discourage them from trouble? There is definitely some truth to this idea; however, a healthy balance must be

maintained. Most students can juggle no more than two or three extracurricular activities per week alongside their academic responsibilities. Time should also be scheduled for assignments and home study! Elementary-age students need 15 to 20 minutes per night; intermediate students take about an hour. High school-aged children will take an hour or two per night.

Another way parents can prepare their children for school is to sit down with them and explain why proper participation with their teachers and respectful behavior in class are important.

Role-playing everyday situations can help students learn how to ask for extra assistance, request the use of the restroom, or politely offer suggestions and participate in

class discussion. While teachers do not necessarily teach such skills explicitly, they may still require students to have them and could make inferences regarding a student's attitude and competence based on how they present themselves in such situations. Inform the children of the principles of effective classroom behavior as well. They are sitting up and leaning forward slightly, 'tracking' the teacher as he or she circles around the room, nodding to indicate careful listening, and contributing through answering or asking questions.

Finally, parents can assist students in getting their study space at home set up with proper light and materials. The computer is best placed in a shared area—like not by the kitchen so that those cooking can stay informed about what's being done on the internet, help

with searching terms, and just monitor safety generally.

Basic supplies should include a generous stock of pens and pencils, lined and unlined paper, construction and colored paper, markers, crayons, colored pencils, sharpener, correction fluid or tape, glue, tape, ruler, geometry set, and dictionary/thesaurus (or access online), as well as the possibility of a timer. The timer can be utilized to structure the homework session so that each subject receives attention, thus maintaining interest through variety and promoting more effective time management during tasks. When the initial day arrives, allow them to assist in arranging a nutritious lunch that they will genuinely consume and bid them farewell with a comforting embrace.

Ask them questions when

they get back—go beyond, 'How was your first day,' to get more than a simple answer. Ask them what they are looking forward to, what bothers them, what texts they might need, who their teachers are, and what they remember about them.

Both four-year schools and vocational colleges offer these options, but availability varies. Be sure to check with the schools you're considering. What do you need? Consider: campus size, reviews from current and past students, and staff credentials. Make sure the school is accredited and licensed. Do they make unrealistic promises? Will your credits transfer?

Four-Year Colleges

Some people pursue education just for the joy of learning, while



others view it as a step toward career advancement. If you enjoy academic challenges, a traditional four-year college might be the right fit for you.

Advantages: A liberal arts education applies to many fields, a wide array of subjects to explore, prestige, and the "college experience."

Disadvantage: expensive, time-consuming, chance of earning a degree in an area you no longer want to pursue, high admission standards, and a sluggish job market upon graduation, which may require further training.

Vocational Schools: If higher education worked for everyone, vocational schools wouldn't exist. Some may see a stigma attached to technical education. In a society where getting a college degree is common, we can overlook the value of skill development. Those who prefer not to attend college may feel out of place and frustrated by societal pressure to enroll anyway.

Advantages: shorter programs, focused curriculums,

less strict admission requirements, flexible schedules, and certifications often not available at four-year colleges, plus hands-on experience.

Disadvantages: might be seen as less prestigious, can be expensive, may not offer as many subjects to explore, concerns about accreditation, and some schools may be profit-driven. Many growing careers don't require a bachelor's degree but do need education after high school.

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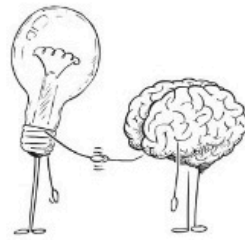
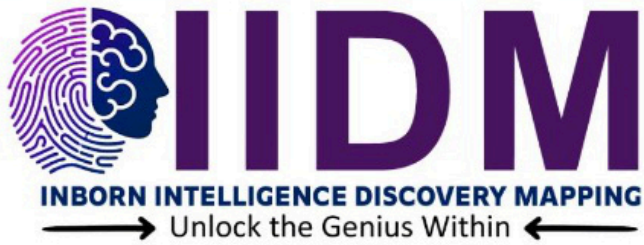
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Growing Demand for Forensic Science Education in India!

Parent Volunteering for School A Helpful Resource for Teachers

It is generally accepted that volunteer efforts at the school district level enable families to share their time and abilities in behalf of the school, teachers, and students. Whether volunteers are involved within the school, in classrooms, or throughout the community, they play an important part in promoting parent involvement and improving student achievement.

We know that certain teachers will be protective about allowing strangers into their classrooms or receiving assistance from people not affiliated with the school system. It might sometimes be easier just to handle things yourself or call on the assistance of family or friends over a weekend or after school. But what might happen if a teacher were to embrace sharing a workload with one or

two committed volunteers?

Numerous strategies can be utilized to recruit and orient volunteers and match their availability and skills with needs of educators, students, and administrators. Two years ago, a Michigan middle school led six parents as "Den Mothers" who were responsible for contacting parents about issues and concerns specific to the grade level assigned to them. There would be two parents from the sixth grade who would create flyers for the sixth grade teacher regarding field trips, remind parents of upcoming meetings, and run fundraisers to purchase needed classroom supplies for the teacher. Two parents were divided among the seventh and eighth grades. The "Den Mothers" meeting was held bi-monthly to discuss ways of parent communication and met

monthly with each instructor. Further communication was done through email and phone. The administrators met with the teachers and their assigned "Den Mothers" every six weeks.

Every "Coordinator" was also responsible for creating a Parent Resource Directory for the grade they were assigned. The directory was used to call on volunteers for field trips and special school events. There is no question that parent volunteers, who serve as classroom and school program assistants and contributors, participants in school activities and events, enhance school programs. By training and coordinating volunteers to assist the schools, educators send an unmistakable message that others and parents are welcome, and that they value their time and expertise.

Here are some guidelines you might consider keeping in mind when planning a volunteer initiative.



serve as the vigilant eyes and ears of the school community, and when something deviates from the norm, rest assured that someone within the community is aware of the situation.

"Training" is the method of teaching volunteers in the particular job-specific skills and behavior they will need to perform their assigned volunteer functions. This is especially important in a school setting, as students and staff will focus on the task and behavior performed by the volunteer in the educational environment.

School level volunteer training should be practical and tailored to the specific needs of the volunteer. If a parent is not a strong reader, don't make her the reader to a group of 2nd graders while the teacher is proctoring a make-up standardized test.

Contact your principal or a school district official to investigate starting a parent volunteer program at your school. If you don't have a volunteer program plan, call the Red Cross. They have lots of experience with volunteer programs and can assist in creating a basic plan for your school. Make sure to involve parents and community members as part of your school volunteer program planning committee.

the school can recruit a pool of retired volunteer teachers to help in the reading or math lab, or with student one-to-one sessions, this is a huge benefit for students, teachers, and parents at almost no cost.
